

The Royal Ministry of Foreign Affairs presents its compliments to the Heads of Mission accredited to Oslo and has the honour to inform them that the preventive measures imposed to limit the transmission of the coronavirus disease COVID-19 are extended through 20 April.

As stated in the Prime Minister's press conference on 7 April, the Norwegian authorities will aim for a gradual reopening of the Norwegian society after the Easter holidays.

Border control, travel restrictions and quarantine measures will continue until further notice. Citizens are advised to avoid unneccessary travels, both abroad and inland. Quarantine of 14 days for individuals permitted to enter Norway from abroad is still in force.

Frequent handwash and social distancing is still regarded as one of the most efficient ways of limiting the spread of the virus. All citizens must comply with these measures. People who experience symptoms of cold or flu must self-isolate.
