

The Royal Ministry of Foreign Affairs presents its compliments to Heads of Mission accredited to Oslo, and has the honour to refer to the circular note of March 13 on new travel restrictions imposed to reduce the spread of coronavirus in Norway, and to clarify entry restrictions for individuals arriving in Norway from non-Nordic countries, with regards to foreign diplomats accredited to Norway and Embassy personnel.

In accordance with Norway's international obligations, holders of Diplomatic and Service Passports, ID Cards and Residence Cards for Foreign Missions issued by Norwegian authorities will not be denied entry or requested to return to the country of origin. They are, however, requested to self-quarantine for 14 days after arrival, in line with the measures enacted by Norwegian Health Authorities. Quarantine should be carried out even if there are no symptoms of disease. If symptoms of disease, individuals must self-isolate until free of symptoms for 7 days.

Personnel from Missions resident in Oslo are strongly encouraged to follow Norwegian Health Authorities guidelines and restrictions and this way contribute to minimizing the spread of the coronavirus disease COVID-19.
