Taking Action to Stop the Spread of Invasive Aquatic Species, Protect Marine Biodiversity and Support Climate Action

Monday 09 June at 16.00 – 17.30. Nice Harbour, onboard the *Statsraad Lehmkuhl* vessel

The protection of marine biodiversity is a global priority — yet invasive aquatic species introduced through ships' biofouling continue to undermine ocean health and resilience. It is time to take action and minimize the introduction and spread through ship's biofouling of these unwanted organisms. Furthermore, good biofouling management supports energy efficient shipping.

The Government of Norway, in cooperation with the Government of Fiji and the International Maritime Organization, is pleased to invite you to attend a high-level event to launch global, coordinated action to address the issue.

The side event will examine the scale of the challenge, explore available solutions, and highlight international efforts to address this issue through strengthened cooperation and policy development. Through keynote statements, presentations, and a short film, the program will highlight the perspective of decision makers, and from experts in the field of biodiversity and technology.
