Mr. Johan Nygaardsvold, Prime Minister of Norway, stated that he had heard with great satisfaction the declaration from the two leading democratic statesmen on the historic meeting in mid-Atlantic. "It is clear to me" he continued "that many important questions with regard to the war ~~must be decided first~~ ^{effort must be settled}, to ensure the victory over nazism and the liberation of the enslaved countries. Most important is it, however, that ~~so~~ ^{such} clear and definite lines have been drawn up with regard to the basis on which the peace will be built.

The Norwegian Government has already emphasized some of these points, which it feels to be of the utmost importance for the future, and it agrees entirely with the eight points in the declaration. It believes that all who have not been blinded by the Nazi megalomania now see clearly that a better understanding and social improvements for ^{all} men and peoples ^{of the world} must form the basis for a happier future.

I may add that the fact that the meeting has taken place on the battlefield in the middle of the fight of the Atlantic will not fail to make a strong impression on all seafaring nations".
